Guidance for Pre-K, K-12 School, and Day Care Programs Provided by Illinois Department of Public Health



SCENARIO (1): Student/staff reports NO symptoms and has a temperature under 100.4.

ATTEND SCHOOL? YES

SCENARIO (2): Student/staff report NO SYMPTOMS and has a temperature under 100.4 **BUT** shares they were in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.

ATTEND SCHOOL? NO

Stay home for 14 calendar days after last exposure to the person with COVID-19. Will attend school/work remotely.

SCENARIO (3): Student/staff report or is observed having one or more COVID-19-like unexplained symptoms. Send student to school nurse.

ATTEND SCHOOL? NO

Must stay home for at least 10 calendar days from onset of symptoms <u>AND</u> 24 with no fever (without fever-reducing medication) <u>AND</u> improvement of symptoms. Will attend school/work remotely.

Household members/siblings should also quarantine.

SCENARIO (4): Student/staff report they have tested positive for COVID-19:

ATTEND SCHOOL? NO

Must stay home for 10 calendar days since testing positive for COVID-19. If symptoms emerge, must stay home for 10 days since symptoms started <u>AND</u> 24 hours of no fever (without fever-reducing medication) <u>AND</u> symptom improvement.

Will attend school/work remotely.

Lake County Public Health Department will be notified and contact tracing will be conducted.

SCENARIO (5): Student/staff report or is observed having one or more COVID-19-like symptoms with an alternative diagnosis without a negative COVID-19 diagnostic test:

ATTEND SCHOOL? MAYBE

The student/staff may learn/work depending on the severity of the symptoms and medical provider directions for treatment. Should stay home until symptoms have improved/resolved per return-to-school criteria for diagnosed condition.

May attend school/work remotely. Medical provider note with alternative diagnosis on file with School Nurse (student) or Human Resources (staff)
