 - Submission of work (portfolios, auditions)



The MHS post-secondary planning quide has been prepared for Mundelein High School students and their parents to provide the basic information needed to conduct a college search, including:





Why Do We Apply to College?


- Determine match/fit
 - Is this college/university a good academic match for me?
 - Is this college/university the right personal fit for me?
- Reflect on your accomplishments
- It separates you from everyone else who didn't apply to college

When to Apply


- Early Decision (ED I, ED II)
- Early Action (EA I, EA II)
- Regular Decision
- Rolling Admission
- Restrictive Early Action
- Acceptance, Denial, Deferral

Application Elements

- Fee
- Application
- List of accomplishments/involvements
- High school/cc transcript
- Educational progression and disciplinary information
- Essay
- Short answer statements
- School report
- Recommendation(s)
- Interview
- Test scores request them early!
- If a schools says don't send it, don't send it!

Demonstrated Interest

- It's more fun to work with a student who wants to work with you
- When you actively engage with a college
 - Fill out a form online
 - Fill out a card at a college fair (even if you already get mail from that school)
 - Attend an event
 - Email/call your admission counselor
 - Visit campus
- Not just a single act
- *Might* make a difference
- Could really make a difference if are waitlisted



College Visits

- Visit if you can
 - Meet faculty, students, and staff
 - Sit in on a class
 - Explore and chat up as many folks as you can
 - Overnight visits after admission
 - If you have the need, ask if the college will pay for or subsidize a visit
 - EAT THE FOOD!
- If visiting is not an option
 - Virtual tour
 - Engage with the school's social media
 - Reach out or ask to be connected with current students/faculty
 - College websites exist for prospective students and families

Special Visit Types

- Auditions
- Athletic Visits
- Scholarship Competitions
- Admitted Student Events



Parents and Guardians

- File the FAFSA if you are able to do so
- Submit the CSS Profile or intuitional aid forms if necessary
- Attend events, visits, and interviews with your student
- Ask questions for your student to answer
- Doing your students' work for them will set them up for failure
- You know your student best, support them appropriately
- Patience, Persistence, Good humor

I've Been Admitted... Now What?

- Value proposition
- Look at the data
 - Retention rates
 - Graduation rates (4 yr, 6 yr)
 - Job/grad school placement rates
 - Campus life
 - Cost
 - Diversity
 - Ignore rankings (they're based on questionable data analysis)
- An investment in your future
 - Cost in relation to outcomes
 - Not all financial aid is the same
 - Total cost of attendance vs scholarship dollars
- Know when it's time to say goodbye
- May 1st is your deadline





Tips and Tricks

- Don't apply to a college you wouldn't attend
- Bring labels to college fairs
- Have a dedicated college email address (or not)
- Read your email
- Email schools you're not interested in or opt out
- Ask for a fee waiver
- Pay attention to total cost of attendance, not just scholarship dollars
- Don't wait until the last second you'll be disappointed
- Take advantage of visit opportunities
- Don't overthink any one element of the process
- Ask for help
- HAVE FUN
