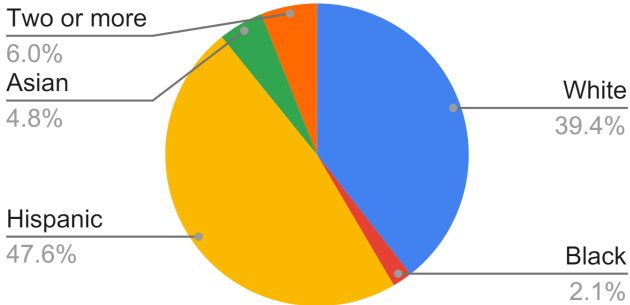

Our School

Mundelein High School is a comprehensive one-building district for grades 9-12. The district covers a 36 square mile area and serves the needs of 2,229 students from Mundelein and surrounding communities. Mundelein is on Chicago's North Shore, about 40 miles north of Chicago. Roughly 88 percent of graduates continue their education at postsecondary institutions.

Equity Statement
