



High school students take the SAT in English Language Arts and Math. The display shows SAT ELA & Math results in four performance levels.




Success by Student Group





School-Level Finance

MHS is a comprehensive high school offering a full selection of services for students and families. We have 140 certified staff (8 counselors, 123 teachers, 3 nurses, 3 psychologists, 5 social workers, and 2 speech pathologist), 17 building and district administrators, and 68 support staff including aides, secretaries, security, and technology.

Facilities

MHS opened the new STEM Center in August 2016 housing 25 classrooms including a STEM lab, Project Lead the Way lab, new science labs, classrooms with collaboration spaces, and a 21st Century Business Incubator classroom.


