
Takeaways from Community Survey

- Conducted to help us understand our community perspective
 - As a "pre" measure (no "sell" included in language)
 - Worked with EO Sullivan Consulting & Core Strategies
- 487 Respondents
 - ➤ Conducted December 12 17
 - Balanced ("weighted") to represent our community's demographics



Takeaways of Community Survey

- This research indicates a high level of community support for the District
 - High participation compared to other districts
 - Overall 76% favorability score; 61% net favorable
 - Positive favorability even among those with low District connection
 - High scores for projects relative to other districts

Takeaways of Community Survey

Before we have informed the community on our needs, we see the highest ranking projects across the community include:

- Career & Technical Education Spaces
- Life Safety, Infrastructure & Mechanicals
- Music & Performing Arts Spaces

Our non-White community members rank the following somewhat higher: Career & Technical Education Spaces, Student Services and Outdoor Athletic Spaces

There is positive support for all projects we asked about.



Takeaways of Community Survey

- Regardless of the exposure respondents have to MHS, the majority of them (~80%) support some tax funding
- It is common that respondents "prefer" lower levels of funding than we are asking for



This data suggests we will have a 3-month "sprint" ahead of us to engage a Community Task Force, to clarify our messaging, and to inform our community about the referendum opportunity to address our current needs and to prepare the District for the future.
