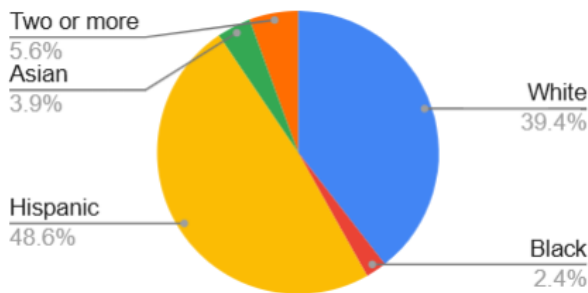

The district covers a 36-square-mile area and serves the needs of 2,127 students from Mundelein and surrounding communities. Mundelein is on Chicago's North Shore, about 40 miles north of Chicago. Roughly 82.5 percent of graduates in the class of 2025 chose to continue their education at postsecondary institutions.
