

What's New & Different



How has remote learning changed and improved from last spring?



Spring to Fall - What has changed?

Asynchronous learning	Synchronous (live) instruction via Zoom five days per week
Students managing all their academic classes each day	Students will focus on four classes per day
Few formal opportunities for summative assessments	Students will engage in portfolios, project based assessments, constructive response, etc.
Grading- pass/incomplete	Grading will return to pre March 13th policies

Remote Learning Schedule Guiding Principles

• Provide a meaningful and quality education for students in remote setting

- Manageable daily course load for students and staff
- Maximize planning time for teachers to navigate online learning best practices

• Provide academic and social emotional interventions

- Leverage opportunities for teachers to provide academic interventions during the school day, while students are in class
- Provide easy access to virtual supports
- Provide both student-directed ('walk-in'), 'teacher-directed' interventions and supports

• Maximize class time to

- Address gaps beginning from last spring,
- Provide structure of the school day

Day in the life of a student

• Zoom protocols

- $\circ \quad \text{Zoom links} \quad$
- Appropriate engagement
- Cameras
- Synchronous learning (live)
 - The class will begin each day with live instruction from the teacher
 - Lessons will include explanations by the teacher, question and answers sessions, collaboration with other students, independent practice, etc.
- Asynchronous work (independent)
 - Students determine the time and pace
 - Can be completed during the 75 minutes or at a later time by the due date.
 - Any work assigned outside the class period should on average take students around 30 minutes to complete

eLearning Expectations



- Assignment and assessment grades can be viewed in Powerschool
- Students will be assessed remotely
- Assessments may include projects, performances, tests, essays, among others
- Students may need their cameras on during an in class assessment

Grading and Assessment



- Performance based courses:
 - Virtual performances
 - Digital collaborative music projects
- Internships
 - If health and safety regulations allow, students will be on site
- Behind the wheel for Driver's Ed
- Physical education
 - Synchronous workouts
 - Use of household items for weight lifting
 - Walking and jogging

Specialty Classes



- Student accommodations and supports are applicable in remote learning
- Staff professional development and support to implement accommodations
- Students will have Individual Remote Learning Plans alongside IEPs
- Teletherapy (enhanced) for related services
- Phase to in person instruction
- Some driveway visits for self-contained programs and students with 1:1 aides


