At Mundelein High School we pride ourselves on our diverse and enthusiastic student body and staff. Our Mundelein teachers and support staff are here to insure the success of your student through high school. Our staff is always here to help and are looking forward to having you and your student be part of our Mustang nation.

GREAT WAYS TO STAY CONNECTED

Volunteer. Volunteering is a great way to become familiar with Mundelein High School. There are many ways to volunteer throughout the school year and the majority of the opportunities don't require a large time commitment. Attend the Open House. Mundelein's annual Open House is a great way for parents to meet their student's teachers and learn about course expectations and what they will be studying.

Stay safe at school. Safety is a priority at Mundelein High School. There are more than 100 security cameras both inside and outside the school building as well as a security staff of professionals. We also have a School Resource Officer on hand every day during the school day. Student safety is our number one priority.

Look for progress reports every six weeks. Teachers share progress reports every six weeks and final grades are released at the end of the semester. Look for information how to log in to PowerSchool to review your student's progress at the beginning of the school year.

Meet your counselor. Students will be assigned to a four-year counselor who will meet with and advise them throughout their four years of high school.

Get involved. Encourage your student to join some of our many clubs, activities and/or sports. Studies have shown that involved students generally have a richer and more rewarding high school experience.

Whether your first student is ready to enter high school, you have other students already attending, your children aren't high school age yet or your children have all graduated, Mundelein High School welcomes you to a new school year. High school is an exciting time and four years can speed by quickly. There can be some trepidation and anxiety about starting high school, but the transition for both students and parents usually is much smoother than one might expect.

Students are gradually acclimated to high school life in their first year with peers and staff ready to assist them. The MHS Link Crew (older students who volunteer as mentors to freshmen) will help guide them with their transition to high school. These are the years to watch students grow, mature, and set their sights on future endeavors.

Learning for the future

In the fall of 2016, the District opened a \$24 million three-story addition to enhance our 21st century learning experience. The addition offers these state-of-the-art facilities:

- Free-standing STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) Lab where students study cutting edge science and technology
- A massive Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Lab
- An array of state-of-the-art Computer Labs
- A Nanotechnology Lab (one of only a few in the United States)
- Many more upgraded facilities



MHS also boasts a **Business Incubator Lab** where students learn how to imagine, create and bring products to life. Students then “pitch” them to local business professionals for advice and possible investment and prototype funds.

In addition to the core classes that are required for graduation, students may choose from an array of elective courses that will prepare them for further advanced study. With the completion of the new building addition, courses in engineering, nanotechnology, computer coding, programming and design; and business development are helping students explore their interests and leading them toward post-secondary study and career opportunities.

Academics

Mundelein High School offers an extensive curriculum for our diverse student population. More than 400 courses are offered in more than 20 disciplines. In addition to courses required for graduation, students may choose from a variety of elective courses as well. MHS provides many opportunities for students to gain knowledge and experience in specialized areas of study that interest them and also prepares them for future endeavors.

Student drop-offs

DROPPING OFF AT MUNDELEIN

The school day starts with first period beginning at 7:45 a.m. Cars should enter the student parking lot from Hawley Street at the main entrance. Then, students should be dropped off by the sidewalk near the school's front entrance. Students should be picked up in the same location.

Between 6:30 a.m.–4 p.m., **please do not use the West Staff Entrance** unless instructed to by a staff member (i.e., bringing a sport team their meal, picking up a sick/injured student, etc.)

PICKING UP AT MUNDELEIN

Eighth period ends at 3:05 p.m. and students should be picked up at the front of the school. Vehicles must enter the main parking lot and follow the carpool line. If your student is not waiting in front when you arrive, please pull into an available parking spot to alleviate congestion.

Absences and tardies

REPORTING A STUDENT'S ABSENCE

In the case of absence, the parent/legal guardian must call the school by 9:15 a.m. on the day of the absence. Emails and notes are not acceptable. Be sure to include the following information in your call:

- Student's name and ID number
- Date and reason for absence
- Name of the person calling in the absence

It is the student's responsibility to make sure a call is received by 9:15 a.m. the day of the absence. Failure to report by 9:15 a.m. on the day of absence may result in the absence remaining unexcused.

An official note (doctor's note, court papers, etc.) must be presented to the Attendance Office within five school days of the absence to be excused after the event. Any doctor notes submitted beyond the five days must be appealed to the Deans' Office. Failure to report an absence on the day of the absence may result in disciplinary action and/or no academic credit for that school day.



EXAMPLES OF EXCUSED ABSENCES

- Illness
- Religious holiday
- Death in the family
- Valid doctor/dentist or court appointment. A student must present valid documentation upon his/her return to school.
- Family emergency (need to be cleared by an administrator if they are to be excused.)

An automated phone call will be made at the end of the day to inform parents of any unexcused absences or tardies. This is a courtesy call and parents should check PowerSchool for specific information.

TARDIES

Mundelein High School believes that student punctuality enhances quality education and reinforces positive work habits. All students are expected to be in their classrooms when the bell rings. A tardy is defined as a student arriving late to class. Tardies are excused for emergency reasons only. Oversleeping, car problems, missing the bus, etc., are not considered emergencies. Parents are required to call the Attendance Office by 9:15 a.m. to explain the reason for any excused tardy.

Student early dismissal or late arrival

The Attendance Office must receive a call by 9:15 a.m. from the student's parent/guardian explaining the reason for their student leaving, and a MHS administrator must approve the excuse, before a student will be allowed to leave campus.

Once the call has been received and the reason has been approved, the student must sign out at the Attendance Office. If the student returns before the end of the school day, they must sign in at the Attendance Office.

Any student leaving the building or returning to the building without following these procedures may be considered unexcused, may be subject to disciplinary action, and may not receive credit for the periods missed.

Additionally, if a student has been called out by a parent or guardian, the student may not remain on school property.

LUNCH PRIVILEGES

Only juniors and seniors with privileges may leave the building during their privilege period or their lunch. Freshmen and sophomores may only leave the building for lunch with permission by a parent/guardian who must also come into the Attendance Office to sign the student out.

PowerSchool

PowerSchool is a confidential and secure website where users access current academic information. Both students and parents/guardians can view class schedules, assignments, attendance information, test scores and find links to teacher email addresses.

Teacher conferences

Teacher conferences with parents/guardians occur twice during the school year; once in October and again in March. In both instances, evening conferences run from 4-7 p.m. followed the next day with conferences from 9 a.m.-2 p.m. Parents/guardians are encouraged to take an active role in the success of their students during their high school years and to work closely with their teachers and counselor.

Visitors at MHS

Visitors are welcome at MHS but for the safety of all students, all but one door at the main entrance are kept locked at all times. Visitors should enter through the far left door of the main entrance and proceed through the main lobby to the Security Desk. Here, they will sign in, indicate who they are visiting, and present a valid driver license or government issued ID. Visitors will then be given a temporary ID card to wear while they are in the building which **must** be returned when leaving campus.

Mundelein High School welcomes former students to visit, but an appointment must be set up prior to visiting with staff members. Classes cannot be interrupted with unexpected visits even though the staff enjoys hearing updates from MHS alumni.

Volunteers should plan to attend a one hour meeting a month, with additional volunteer activities each lasting two to three hours.

Mundelein High School students have an array of clubs and activities to choose from to develop their interests outside of the classroom. Through participation in clubs and activities, students learn how to work together, set and reach goals, enjoy and develop friendships, and work for the good of others. MHS also offers about 40 school-sponsored clubs and activities like Homecoming, Turnabout, Variety Show, Mr. Mustang Contest, and more.

Academic Team. Members participate in scholastic bowl competitions against other area high schools.

After School Coalition. Provides safe after school activities for students.

Asian Culture Club. For any student interested in Asian culture.

Art Club. Open to students of all grade levels who are interested in creating art.

Band

Marching Band. An instrumental ensemble that performs during MHS football games and at local marching band festivals.

Honors Wind Ensemble, Honors Symphonic Winds, Symphonic Band and Concert Band. Perform regular concerts at MHS and participates in area festivals. They also meet as a class during the school day.

Jazz Ensemble and Jazz Orchestra. Perform big band music and participates in festivals throughout the Midwest. They also meet as a class during the school day.

Pep Band. Comprised of all students in Concert Band and performs at boys and girls basketball games.

Pit Orchestra. An auditioned group that provides the music for the spring musical.

Show Choir Combo. An auditioned group that accompanies the three MHS show choirs.

Percussion Ensemble. Perform using various percussion instruments.

Best Buddies Club. This club is made up of students who “partner” with peers with special needs.

Black Student Union. This club creates more diverse activities for the student body, raises cultural awareness, and deepens appreciation for black culture.

Book Club. For students who love to read. Meets several times each month before school.

Broadcasting Team. Responsible for creating videos that capture student life and events at MHS.



Byte Club. Dedicated to raising awareness and interest in computer programming and coding.

Changing My Lifestyle. A wellness club focusing on the overall well-being of MHS students.

Chess Club. All levels welcome. Come and play chess, learn how to play, improve your game or just watch. Meets on Tuesdays after school from August through February.

Choir

Concert Choir. Includes Chorale, Bella Voce, Concert Choir, Master Singers and The Noteables (an all abilities choir).

Show Choir. Three separate choirs who perform at concerts and in competitions. There is a girls choir, a boys choir and a mixed choir.

Co-Exist. Part of a national youth movement encouraging the understanding and celebration of all people regardless of race, religion, nationality or sexual orientation.

Color Guard. Performs choreographed routines to the music of the Marching Band at half-time shows and competitions.

Economics Club. Offers opportunities for students to apply economic thinking and skills in competitive settings.

Educators Rising. Allows students to gain tutoring experience and learn about the teaching profession.

Diversity Club. Dedicated to the education of its members about issues of diversity and discrimination through analysis of related media.

Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA). Students travel to leadership conferences, run the school store, participate in academic competitions and service learning projects. FBLA is for career-minded students and is nationally recognized by college recruiters.



Link Crew. A high school transition program that welcomes freshmen and makes them feel comfortable throughout their first year of their high school career.

Math Team. A competitive math club that participates in several meets each year at regional, sectional and state levels.

Mock Trial Team. Competes against other schools and attends the Illinois State competition each year. Members learn how to argue a case in an actual courtroom.

Model UN (Model United Nations). Allows students to participate in the premier Model UN program in Illinois. Students work with and compete against other teams debating real-life crises such as poverty, women's rights, environmental issues, armed conflict, and many more.

Mundelein Theatre. Produces three mainstage productions each year including a spring musical. They also produce several studio productions including student-directed one-act plays and New Faces Production for freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have never appeared on the MHS mainstage. There are also opportunities for acting, directing, tech, design and choreography.

The Mustang Newspaper. Students work as reporters and writers for the school newspaper, *The Mustang*. They also learn and practice photography and graphic design techniques.

NHS (National Honor Society). NHS is based on four tenets: scholarship, leadership, character and service. Students who meet the requirements after two years of high school will be invited to begin the application process.

Orchesis. For all students interested in dancing. All skill levels are welcome and no experience is needed.

Philosophy Club. Fosters an appreciation of various philosophical schools of thought among its members.

Film Club. Offers students a chance to create original videos and films.

French Club. For all students with an interest in French culture—not just for students taking French.

Gaming Club. For students interested in any type of games—video, card, and board games.

Interact Club. A service organization affiliated with Rotary International. Students make lunches for the homeless, raise money for school and art supplies for homeless children, hold a senior prom for the elderly and many other projects.
