Jazz Ensemble

The Mundelein High School Jazz Ensemble from Mundelein, IL, is one of two curricular jazz bands that are audition-based and open to all 9th through 12th grade students. The band program at Mundelein High School enrolls over 225 students in four concert bands.

Throughout the school year the band performs over a dozen times in a variety of venues including concerts at the school, jazz festivals in the Midwest and jazz venues around the Chicagoland area including Fitzgerald's Nightclub in Berwyn, Nellies in Palatine, and The Jazz Showcase in Chicago.

In the past several years the Mundelein High School Jazz Ensemble has been named Honor Band at the Purdue Jazz Festival, Eau Claire Jazz Festival, and has been selected to perform two times at the Illinois Music Education Conference (2016, 2020).

Concert Bands

Mundelein High School offers four concert bands, which are the core of our band program. Students continue to develop the fundamental skills of instrumental performance through participation in these groups. Each concert band meets during one period of the school day during both fall and spring semesters. Enrollment in a concert band class is a prerequisite for participation in other band program activities.

Jazz Bands

Mundelein High School offers two jazz bands which are an important component of the MHS band program. Each jazz band rehearses for one class period and participates in concerts at the school and around the local community including the Mundelein Invitational, hosted annually by MHS Bands. Students must be enrolled in a concert band to enroll in a jazz band.

Marching Mustangs

Marching Mustangs provide an opportunity for all MHS band students to perform together as one ensemble. The Marching Mustangs perform at each home football game as well as at two festivals each year and students must attend one week of Summer Marching Band Camp. Marching Band participation is required for all students enrolled in concert band classes.

Band students



Over 53% of band students enrolled in at least one AP course. Collectively, 257 AP course enrollments are represented by current band students.



...play sports and participate in clubs

Approximately 50% of band students participate in a sport and are represented in all seasons (fall, winter, spring). 65% of band students participate in a club.



...excel in academics

The simple GPA for MHS band students is 3.48. (MHS average is 3.02)

Andy Sturgeon is in his fifteenth year as a music teacher and ninth year at Mundelein High School. At Mundelein High School he teaches the Honors Symphonic Winds and Freshmen Concert Band as well as the Honors Jazz Ensemble and Beginning Guitar classes. He also directs the Noise Show Choir combo and co-directs the Marching Mustangs and the Mundelein High School Pep Band. Before coming to Mundelein High School, Mr. Sturgeon taught band in Evergreen Park, IL, and worked with the Wheeling High School and John Hersey High School band programs in the northwest suburbs of Chicago. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and a Master's Degree in Educational Leadership from Concordia University. Mr. Sturgeon is an active trombone player and played with the Northshore Concert Band for nine years.



TerryShelato MHS DIRECTORS OF BANDS

Jerry Shelato is in his twenty-seventh year as a music teacher and ninth year at Mundelein High School. At Mundelein High School he teaches the Honors Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band as well as the Jazz Orchestra and Intermediate Guitar classes. He also directs the Spring Musical pit orchestra and co-directs the Marching Mustangs and the Mundelein High School Pep Band. Mr. Shelato has previously taught in the Champaign and Urbana school districts and has taught conducting and music education methods during his years of graduate study. He holds Bachelor's and Master's Degrees in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, where he has also completed Doctoral coursework in Music Education. Mr. Shelato plays the tuba and has performed with Wayne Shorter, John Patitucci, Brian Blade, Danilo Pérez, the University of Illinois Jazz Band I, and the avant-jazz ensemble Ear Doctor.

Rob Parton began his tenure at The University of North Texas in the Fall of 2019 and is currently the chair of the Division of Jazz Studies and director of the Two O'Clock Lab Band. As a trumpet performer, Rob Parton has been called on to perform or record the music of diverse composers from Karel Husa to Leonard Bernstein to Duke Ellington. He has performed with many of America's major orchestras including the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, the Cleveland Orchestra, the New York Philharmonic, and the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. He has also performed as lead trumpet on numerous Broadway shows in the Midwest and with Grammy, Tony, and Academy Award-winning artists from Faith Hill to Natalie Cole to Tony Bennett. As a recording artist, he has Records, Sea Breeze and Sony record labels.

Dr. Christopher Madsen's credits as a saxophonist include performances and recordings with Paul Simon, Wynton Marsalis, Jeff Hamilton, Makaya McCraven, Michael Dease, Ulysses Owens, Ben Williams, Marquis Hill, Jon Irabagon, and countless others. He is a published composer with Kendor Music, Inc., the UNC Jazz Press, and Walrus Music. From 2008 to 2014, he served as Jazz Studies Coordinator for Northwestern University and is currently a member of the Jazz Studies faculty at the University of Illinois at Chicago and the University of Wisconsin at Parkside. A graduate of the Juilliard, DePaul University, and University of Illinois music schools, Madsen is also a Vandoren and Conn-Selmer artist and member of the College Music Society, NAfME, National Educator's Association, and JEN. He has presented clinics, conducted ensembles, and performed around the U.S. and the world.
