A Note from a Retiring Theatre Director

Over the course of my 21 years at Mundelein High School, you can count the number of times I have included *Director Notes* in the programs for my shows on one hand. I always preferred to let the work speak for itself. But on the occasion of my last show at MHS, it seemed like the proper thing to do.

How does one take stock of a career? Numbers? That is easy. During my time as Director of Theatre at MHS, we provided 128 performing opportunities for students. I personally directed 60 shows - 40 plays and 20 musicals. I coached/directed 9 Shakespeare Slam teams and supervised 19 student directed productions. We did 9 summer shows which featured Mundelein Theatre alumni.

Since I announced my retirement earlier this year, I have been asked countless times about my favorite shows or memories in my time here. There are certainly some that come to mind. Having the good fortune to direct the world high school premiere of *Trust*, by David Schwimmer and Andy Bellin always comes to mind. The shows that we took to Theatre Fest (*Dancing at Lughnasa, Trust, The Elephant Man*). Sellout productions of *Les Misérables* and *In the Heights*. Having ABC and NBC news doing live coverage of our summer remount of *The Secret Garden*, which we brought back because one of the lead performers had a health issue and was unable to perform during the regular run. And mounting a 6-show season during COVID (which included a full Shakespeare productions.

But the true highlight of my years at MHS will be the relationships. Each of those 128 productions holds a place in my heart filled with wonderful memories, lots of laughs, and the occasional tear. I have been blessed to work with some of the finest educators and humans ever on the theatre staff and in the performing arts department. I have always had great support from the theatre families. Mundelein Theatre was a place where my own family could call home. I have great memories of my three kids coming to rehearsals with Dad over the years. It allowed my wife and I to reunite onstage, having met 40 years earlier while doing a play together. But at the core, this job was always about the students. They are the reason I kept coming back everyday and putting in the time to do what was necessary to give them the best possible experience. Their energy, passion, curiosity, and love meant the world to me. I will miss them.








